### NEXT MONTH: Group B Meetup in October

We are planning another Group B Meetup for next month over Zoom, probably in the 3rd week of October. Last March, we had 24 attendees from 17 Group B water systems who attended our first Group B Meetup where they heard a presentation on Group B roles and responsibilities and spent more than an hour discussing issues and questions from the group. Next month's meeting will again include an open forum for questions and issues, preceded by a discussion on water rates. An invitation to the meetup will be sent to all those who attended the last meeting along with any subscriber to this newsletter who belongs to a Group B water system. ## Reminder: Lead Service Line Inventory is due October 16, 2024

- This was a topic at June's Quarterly Meeting. If you didn't attend or just want to refresh your
  memory, you can view the meeting recording <u>June Q2 Meeting Video</u>. The Lead and Copper
  presentation starts at 43 minutes, 25 seconds (43:25). There's additional information and support
  available for Group A systems working on compliance with the new Lead Service rules.
- The September <u>ODW newsletter</u> includes some additional options for technical assistance with the inventory and related communications and includes some information on the penalties for failing to meet the deadline.

## Scholarship/Apprenticeship Program

As you probably know, WIWSA offers scholarships each year to qualified applicants who enroll in Evergreen Rural Water's <u>Apprenticeship program</u>. We have one apprentice returning for a second year this year (2024-2025). We had hoped that we'd also award an additional scholarship to a new applicant, but no one chose to apply despite interest from several candidates. 


# News from our Partners
